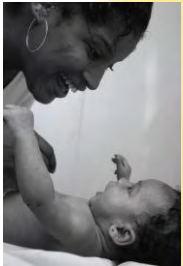


Help Us Evaluate the Online and Applied System for Intervention Skills (OASIS) Training Program for Parents of Children with Autism

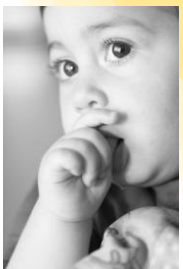
About the project: We're evaluating a training program based on Applied Behavior Analysis for parents of children with autism. We want to know how effective this training program is in teaching you how to develop your child's independent skills and manage his/her challenging behaviors. Families participating in this project will go through the complete training program. Parents will complete web-based training modules and apply the skills learned in the modules with guidance from a trained clinician. The clinician will provide immediate feedback about your use of these skills while you work one-on-one with your child during therapy sessions. The clinician will talk with you via a live audio/video feed at an off-site clinic. The training program will take approximately sixteen weeks to complete. Throughout the program, we'll assess your child's behaviors using standardized assessments; we'll also assess your learning and satisfaction with the training program.

Benefits of participating:



- You will learn new strategies to manage your child's behavior and promote his/her independence
- You will receive free assessments of your child's development
- You will help us better understand how to train parents of children with autism who want to learn effective ways to work with their children
- You could be compensated up to \$250 for participation

You can participate if:



- Your child is between 2 and 5 years old
- You plan to stay in the Kansas or Missouri area for 1 year
- You can make weekly trips to your local training site
- You are at least 21 years old, with at least a high school diploma/GED
- Your child has been diagnosed with autism within the last 18 months
- English is your primary language
- You have easy access to the Internet (at home, local library, work, etc.)
